Spirit of Courage 2020 Another Successful Year!

COVID-19 has thrown us all for a loop, but it really tested us when it came to Spirit of Courage this year. We might have panicked just a little bit in the beginning when we realized there was no way to have an in person event for a group of our size. Many other groups in our community had already been forced to cancel their big events, and we certainly hoped ours wouldn't be added to that list.

We have had the pleasure of working with Lesley Brandt, (Dr. Tom Brandt's daughter) as "Dance to the Beat" has grown over the last few years. Lesley's firm, Planit Inc., delivers innovative ideas and solutions for meetings and event planning. We were certainly in need of some "innovative ideas." After some discussions with the team at Planit, Inc., we were assured we could pull off a virtual gala and an on-line auction and still make a big difference for our patients. We also want to give a huge shout out to long-time volunteer, Mike Mckay, who once again spent hours upon hours creating videos to promote the event as well as highlight our past 60 Spirit of Courage Recipients. The Virtual Gala and Auction were held on Thursday evening, August 13th. We really had no idea what to expect since this was a totally new concept for us. We set a \$35,000 goal for the evening. Thanks to the support of our event sponsors, past recipients, Jennie Family and community, this year's Spirit of Courage Event raised just under \$80,000. One hundred percent of dollars raised will be donated to the Spirit of Courage Cancer Center Charitable Patient Care Fund, providing assistance to uninsured and under insured patients who need help covering expenses associated with diagnosis and treatment of cancer. This fund assists patients by paying for medications, treatments and everyday living expenses such as groceries, rent, and gas. Without this type of help, some of the more vulnerable members of our community would simply forgo treatment.

The virtual gala consisted of a 30 minute presentation on Zoom. The program included our Master of Ceremonies, Dave Webber, with remarks from Dr. Zlomke and our President and CEO, Steve Baumert. A highlight reel of past recipients was also included in the program. Over 100 attendees logged in and watched the program virtually! Following the program the online auction stayed open until 9pm where we were able to raise over \$16,000 through auction items alone!

Thank you to all of our sponsors and donors for making Spirit of Courage 2020 so successful in a year filled with uncertainty.



In 2019, the Auxiliary raised over \$190,000 through Jennie's Gift Shop sales, Pharmacy Annex sales, Auxiliary Year-End Giving Campaign and funds raised through Spirit of Courage related activities. These funds were used to support the ongoing operation and maintenance of the Medi-Van transportation system. Healthwise:

Stop the Spread of Rumors

Know the facts about Coronavirus



Information provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

1. Diseases can make anyone sick regardless of their race or ethnicity. Fear and anxiety about COVID-19 can cause people to avoid or reject others even though they are not at risk of spreading the virus.
2. For most people, the immediate risk of becoming seriously ill from the virus that causes COVID-19 is thought to be low. Some people may have an increased risk for more serious complications from COVID-19 and should take measures to protect themselves.
3. Someone who has completed quarantine or has been released from isolation does not pose a risk of infection to other people.
4. There are simple things you can do to help keep yourself and others healthy.

- wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
- Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- stay home when you are sick.
- cover you cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash
- wear a mask when you are out in public
- maintain social distancing guidelines, put 6 feet of distance between yourself and people who don't live in your household.




Pink Out 2020

Upcoming Flu Shot Clinics - yes it's that time of year again!

Flu shot clinics will be held on September 28th and 29th from 6:30 am - 7:00 pm, in the old Cardiac Rehab area directly across from the A/B elevator on first floor. The hospital will once again be utilizing the Pod Dispensing method, a technique used with emergency services. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, reducing the spread of respiratory illness, like flu, this fall and winter is more important than ever. As volunteers you are eligible to participate in the flu clinic free of charge (even if you are not currently volunteering). Just bring your hospital issued ID badge with you when you come for your shot. Volunteers who work directly with patients are required to have a flu shot in order to work.
